Caroline,

Thank you for your comments. One of the main motivations for BPTS over the last two years has been to improve driver attentiveness, and pedestrian safety at crossings. This has been motivated by many resident comments and observations during that time, and since the inception of the Committee. As a result a detailed study, directed by BPTS to focus on select locations has been completed, a report compiled and the recommendations for changes accepted. These changes are now being implemented as Public Works time and resources allow. The motivation to use rapid flashing beacons was proposed to and supported by the Committee, and recommended in the study. I agree with you that flags can work, but these also need maintenance, replacement and monitoring to ensure they are available. I truly believe that beacons are the best option for pedestrian safety.

Subject: BPTS comments

Good evening Chair Holland,

Thank you for allowing me to share my comments during oral communication. As we have stated before we cannot expect our volunteers to attend other meetings, but what happened last month is only adding to the existing problems and could have been avoided if all accurate data is properly shared. Please share our comments with the other BPTS members.

I also want to repeat my comments I have made on several occasions regarding the flashing beacons as it happened again today around 4.32 PM by the Shell station at the end of Alpine Road. A father on the bike with child on a separate bike were trying to cross Alpine Road. I was able to stop and alert the cars behind me in a timely matter with the appropriate distance. That is not always the case.

I asked if he tried to push the button to activate the flashing beacon and he replied yes but it is broken.

Flashing beacons are not only expensive to install, they are expensive to repair and they are very unreliable. How often are the ones in Ladera broken, how often do we see pedestrians in a hurry, on their phone, not even attempting to push the button. The school district in Menlo Park uses crossing guards in addition to their flashing beacons - The ASCC did not approve the flashing beacons in our scenic corridor. The flag system works fine. The problems we are referring to are the entrances of Woodside Priory, the site of the current crossing, the lack of visibility, the lack of middle lane to properly turn in and out of their main entrance, and visibility- The stop sign is too far from the road, there is a bus stop on the right, and too many streets closely with the same problems (e. G Georgia Lane, Willow Brook, and Corte Madera....)

Please read all the comments of residents that made it in the public comments. Another problem we have reported over the last few years.

Happy New Year!

In 2017 parents addressed their concerns again about our major crossings on Alpine and Portola Road; especially the ones by Woodside Priory, Corte Madera, and Triangle Park.

Thanks to your efforts and the efforts of Public Works Director Young, these public safety issues were brought to Town Council. Town Council approved a traffic safety study in 2018, moved 30 K from its reserves to fund the study, and approved a budget of 285 K on August 14, 2019.

Residents have repeatedly requested updates since 2019 because we did not see the plan being implemented.

The minutes of the last BPTS meeting on December 1, 2021 confirm one of those requests under #3. The reply was : "There had been no recent discussion on the Priory or Georgia Lane " and " the BPTS Committee will address the Neely Winery parking in a future meeting.

During the last Planning Commission meetings in December, residents again brought up their concerns about increased traffic and unresolved public safety issues at Woodside Priory and anticipated new issues for the proposed and now approved projects: the Neely Winery and Willow Commons.

The minutes for the December 15, 2021 are not available yet, but many residents attended that meeting. While the report stated: :

Staff engaged with Krupka Consulting to assess the potential impacts in site traffic and parking generation caused by the applicant's CUP amendment. In sum, the consultant noted "It is the Consultant's professional opinion that the proposed CUP Amendment will not be substantial relative to existing local street traffic volumes and site parking supply." The report concluded fifteen more on-site parking spaces were required based on the requested student body increase; the applicant has agreed to provide these spaces in the immediate future.

The Town Attorney has reviewed the applicant's response letter and agrees with the analysis.

The traffic data was not presented during that meeting, nor was the Masterplan and it's traffic study of 2004, but after discussion with Board members and remarks by residents Traffic Consultant Mr Krupka later admitted that he has witnessed **illegal and dangerous behavior**. The Attorney for Woodside Priory claimed there have been no accidents, but as you remember there was a bike/car incident at the main entrance of Woodside Priory about 2 years ago. Now the Priory has 2 entrances that are dangerous.

BPTS and Public Works Director Young have submitted our concerns in 2017 and advised Town Council. Town council approved and funded the study in 2018. Town Council approved the implementation of improvements and allocated a budget of \$285,000 to do the work in 2019. (See Town Council meeting 8/14/2019).

The handbook confirms that the Town Manager is responsible for the delivery of programs and services authorized in the Town Council adopted budget and that it is the chair's role to ensure its activities are coordinated with those of Town staff with consultation with the Town Manager.

Please resolve our ongoing traffic and public safety issues.
