


What is a Safety Element?

One of seven mandatory elements of the general plan Includes:

- background and technical information,
- maps
- goals and policies,
- implementation actions/ programs

Intended to guide development priorities for a Town/City over a long timeframe (typically 20 years)

Certain element (Housing and Safety) require more frequent updates (tied to new legislation)



^{*} Required if Disadvantaged Communities are located in the Jurisdiction

^{**} Required in certain locations within California

What is a Safety Element?

Govt Code 65302 (g) (1) - Protection of the Community From Unreasonable Risks Associated With:

Seismically induced surface rupture

Ground Shaking

Flooding

Tsunami, Seiche, and Dam Failure

Subsidence

Liquefaction

Ground Failure

Wildland and Urban Fires

Slope Instability (Mudslides and Landslides)

Military Installations Peakload Water Supply Requirements

Min. Road Widths & Clearances Around Structures

Evacuation Routes

What is a Safety Element?

Evacuation Analysis (SB 99) Climate Adaptation (SB 379) SB 1035

links the Housing and Safety Elements

Housing Element Update (SB 1035)

Safety Element Update Wildfire Hazards (SB 1241) SB 1241

compliance includes oversight by Cal Fire

A Safety Element is NOT?

Not In a Safety Element	Where it is more appropriate
A short range action plan	Other plans like a Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP) or a Storm Drain Master Plan.
An extremely detailed document	More detailed documents may include highly focused studies/ analysis (fault studies, brush management plans).
Highly regulatory	The Town's municipal code is the primary regulatory document that dictates how development occurs.
Highly prescriptive	Documents like design guidelines, master plans, or ordinances are better tools for this.

The Safety Element can identify the creation of all of these.

Portola Valley's Safety Element Update

In May 2022, the Town prepared four memos to receive feedback and guidance from community members while drafting the Safety Element:

- 1. Geologic, Seismic, and Flooding Hazards,
- 2. Climate Change Adaptation and Resilience,
- 3. Wildfire Hazards, and
- 4. Analysis of Developments with One-way of Ingress and Egress (Senate Bill (SB) 99 Analysis).

Each memo included:

- Historical data
- Existing conditions information
- Relevant existing policies, and
- Best practice recommendations for new policies and programs.

Portola Valley's Safety Element Update

This Update builds from the existing Safety Element and incorporates:

- Preliminary Community and Committee Input
- New information on flooding, wildfires, emergency evacuation, and climate change, as required by recent State Law
- Guidance from State and regional agencies
- Cal Fire Checklist Requirements
- Best Practices


