2. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS FOR ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA

a. Email from Katharina Stromeyer regarding equestrians and bikes on trails where they shouldn't be. F. Leach suggested the T&PC publish a monthly or quarterly memo with trail updates, reminders, seasonal information, etc. S. Wernikoff said this is

generally posted through the town newsletter, on the town website, and committee's often choose to post on the PV Forum as well. F. Leach said he would be happy to write and will follow-up with S. Wernikoff.

b. L. Babb suggests the committee votes whether we want to be a Brown Act committee or a Town Manager committee. Can it be on the agenda for the next meeting?

3. OLD BUSINESS

a. Approve meeting minutes from past meeting (2.28.24)

b. Hawthorns

- Next meeting is this Sunday in person on the Hawthorns property. A new proposal for parking was recently posted which uses existing entrance to property across from Roberts and in this proposal parking would be visible from the scenic corridor.
- K. Corley would like to know if Howard has been in touch with MidPen regarding the Alpine Trail and parking. Howard said no, the town has not submitted a formal proposal yet. S. Wernikoff reminds it is an ongoing process and will not come to town council until about 9 months from now.

c. Maps - Trails + Safe Routes

- F. Leach working with S. Wernikoff and J. Hasko regarding process to post to website
- S. Gold asked about Alpine Canyon Trail; given it is currently inaccessible/impassable, she questioned advertising to public. F. Leach reminded it is a Westridge Trail, not a town trail, and we follow their guidance. F. Leach says it is still considered a trail and important to keep shown as a trail to support process of re-opening. L. Babb has approval from Westridge regarding the trails that are shown on map.
- L. Babb would like to see map accessible on a service like Avenza. F. Leach suggested we need to look into software license. H. Young said this would be a new budget request. F. Leach will do research on cost.
- J. Davis provided update that the SRTS map will be included in next month's agenda packet with goal of posting to website following next meeting. J. Davis asked Howard for an update on the flashing beacon at Alpine Hills crosswalk. H. Young said they are making progress but currently working with PG&E on infrastructure.
- K. Corley pointed out that Woodside has committed putting up to \$1million to SRTS. C. Vertongen asked for guidance from town council liaison how to make progress on SRTS. S. Wernikoff suggested C. Vertongen follow-up with her directly.

d. Town Hike

• B. Eckstein is working to get a meeting with Lucy Neely.

e Horse Fair

• Date is May 18, 11am-2pm. B. Eckstein is working on insurance.

f. Capital Improvements

- April is when we put in requests for capital improvements. S. Gold suggests Shady Trail go on capital improvements list. H. Young mentions budget constraints in coming year.
- K. Corley pointed out some issues on Portola Trail, Alpine Trail and Sweet Springs. H. Young suggested she take pictures and post to PV Connect so he can take a look at.
- Send ideas for capital improvements to F. Leach and next meeting we will discuss.

g. Trail Maintenance Review

- Town has been clearing water bars and fallen trees; the Sausal trail ditch was filled. Awaiting dry weather to work on additional trail maintenance.
- H. Young reminds mowing begins in May. F. Leach checked we are not mowing wildflowers pre-maturely as this comes up every year. H. Young states there is a mowing schedule and that some trails are delayed because of certain wildflowers however it has to be balanced with dates that we have to meet for mowing set by fire department.
