May 1, 2024

At the Schoolhouse and on Zoom

Bicycle, Pedestrian and Traffic Safety (BPTS) Community Meeting

1. Call to Order and Roll Call

Chair Holland called the meeting to order at 8.18 AM

In attendance were Chair Ed Holland and members Patt Baenen, Angela Hey, Caroline Vertongen, and Kevin Welch.

Town Council liaison, Mary Hufty, San Mateo County Sergeant Patrick Taylor, and residents Kristi Corley and Jerrie Welch, attended the meeting via zoom.

2. Oral communication

Resident and member of PV Cultural Arts Committee, Jerrie Welch, announced that PV Palooza will take place on June 1, 2024. It is the third PV Palooza event. She further explained how it is no longer organized through the PV Cultural Arts Committee, but through their own 501 C3 foundation to alleviate a lot of work pressure on PV staff. They are looking for volunteers. She asked if BPTS members could help at the event e.g. diverting traffic in front of the schoolhouse, check the entrance of the parking lot, and ensure that people are not parking on Portola Road. Her husband, BPTS member Kevin Welch, has already committed to volunteer and she is hoping other members will sign up as well-more information and volunteer sign up using their website www.pvpalooza.com.

Chair Holland thanked Jerry and confirmed he will also contact the CERT team to coordinate help for that event.

Member Welch asked Sgt. Taylor if San Mateo County Sheriffs' office will offer assistance on June 1, 2024.

Sgt. Taylor did confirm and marked it on his calendar.

Chair Holland (@ 11.05 min) also brought up the June 14 - the Portola Valley School district (PVSD) graduation car parade. Mid morning for Ormondale and later for Corte Madera. He is in touch with the coordinator and the CERT team. Sgt. Taylor acknowledged the service request.

3. Approval of October Meeting Minutes

Chair Holland (@13.29 min) proposed that the minutes of the April 3, 2024 meeting be approved. Member Hey approved the minutes, seconded by Member Welch. The minutes were unanimously approved by all members.

4. Sheriff's Report

Sheriff's Sgt. Taylor gave the report (@14.30 min)

a. Traffic Citations

There were:

- 11 Moving citations Alpine/Westridge Area
- no collisions
- 13 parking citations

Member Hey asked to have more speeding citations on Alpine Road.

Sgt. Taylor explained the discretionary process, but will ask his deputies to focus on speeding violations.

- The. Annual report shows no accident, but a total of 90 citations for Jan-March 2024- see report.

Member Hey (@ 16.30 Min) noticed that the citations were issued during 8 days out of 31 days and questioned what happens during the rest of the month.

Sgt. Taylor (@17 min) explained how the shifts work and how the services are shared with other communities as per the sheriff's contract with the Town.

Member Vertongen asked if the Sheriff"s department is still occupying the office at Town Center- the answer was yes.

b. Requests for Sheriff's Office Attention Pertaining to Traffic and Public Safety

Member Welch (@18.25 min) addressed his concern about PV shoulder lanes, bicyclists biking shoulder to shoulder, forcing the motorist to cross the double yellow line. He wondered if "we" could do something about this in a friendly way to bring awareness to the bicyclists?

Sgt. Taylor explained the "no lane sharing policy", the new 3 foot rule, and confirmed that bicyclists can ride side by side.

Member Baenen asked Sgt. Taylor about the citation given to the driver who crossed the double yellow line following the 3-foot rule to avoid a biker. She wondered if he has the details of that incident.

Sgt. Taylor (@23.05min) explained that there is no perfect solution right now. All agencies are after the 3 foot rule was imposed. His deputies use discretion to enforce the law. Drivers cannot cross over a double yellow line unless it is an emergency.

Sgt. Taylor showed the pamphlet created by the San Mateo County Sheriff's office to help understand the rules established to improve Bike Safety. He offered to send some to the BPTS Committee

Chair Holland (@25.20 min) and member Baenen thanked Sgt. Taylor and explained it would be very helpful to distribute those at upcoming events and for future recruitment. zAttached Sheriff's Reports

c. Upcoming events

Chair Holland announced the Zots for Tots event, which will take place on September 21, and asked Sgt. Taylor and the San Mateo County Sheriff's department to help during that event

Member Baenen reminded Sgt. Taylor about the incidents at the Zots for Tots last year. The officer in charge was not paying attention to the bikes and stated it was really dangerous

Chair Holland confirmed he is also working with the CERT team, the Emergency Preparedness Committee, and the Sheriff's department - hoping for a smoother coordination for the Zots for Tots event this year.

5. Public Works Update

a. General update

PV PW Director Young was absent.

Sgt. Taylor confirmed the services.

Chair Holland (@33.46min) confirmed he is not aware of any updates. PV PW director Young had informed him that he was on vacation; therefore, could not attend this month's BPTS meeting. Chair Holland asked if other members had any PW updates.

b. Crosswalk upgrades timetable for completion and budget information.

Member Hey (@34 min) confirmed she had purchased some crosswalk flags and intends to install them by the Corte Madera school crosswalk and possibly by Alpine Hills Tennis

Resident Corley raised concerns about the possibility, but Member Hey confirmed the installation by Alpine Hills.

6. Ongoing Committee Business

a. Request for Volunteer Assistance with Updating and Rewriting the Committees Handbook.

Chair Holland (@ 34.40min) stated he had received a request from Patty Dewes who is in the process of rewriting the handbook and who is seeking volunteers.

Chair Holland confirmed he did volunteer and asked if there were any other volunteers Member Vertongen asked for the timeline, but the Chair did not know at the time. Member Baenen offered to help with the graphics

b. Adoption of 2019 Pedestrian Safety study as Local Roadway Safety Plan, and Submission to C/CAG

Chair Holland (@35.37min) gave a summary and asked if the subcommittee had an update.

Member Hey confirmed that the subcommittee had met and reviewed plans from other towns to understand what PV is missing. While there is no update at this time, they hope to have one at the next BPTS meeting.

Chair Holland confirmed PV PW Director Young had been in communication with C/CAG and there seem to be changes for the timeline- confirming the flexibility for the deadlines.

Member Hey did confirm that flexibility. She also shared what other Towns do when and how they submit their grant. She confirmed another upcoming grant cycle with deadline in May 2025 and wondered if PV should submit a grant application to upgrade the bike path on Alpine Road. PV has the Willow Commons and Stanford projects on Alpine Road. She suggested to apply for the grant and make a Class 1 bike lane on Alpine Road.

Member Welch warned about the limitations and PV expectations.

Chair Holland suggested to talk to PV PW Director Young because grant application request the involvement and support of the Town.

Resident Corley (@38 min) urged the Committee and Town to apply for any grant especially if it could improve bike and pedestrian safety. The Town has a 1.5 million deficit. She does not understand why PV would not apply. PV could use the money. It would be nice to have a class 1 path for bikes and pedestrians and improve their safety. Resident Corley brought up the left turn pocket lane proposed by the Hawthorne Project. She reminded the issues during school traffic at 8 AM and 3 PM. Traffic in both direction while hikers are out at the same time.

She would like to see the Town plan ahead rather than in the rear. San Mateo should be involved before the driveways are approved. Resident Corley requested to see her comments in the minutes and see them almost exact.

Member Vertongen confirmed that her comments are in the minutes. Resident Corley thanked the committee.

c. Hawthorns PAWG update, and requests for input.

Chair Holland @ 40min) summarized the item and referred to the PV Hawthorn working group

Member Baenen, who is a member of the AdHoc Hawthorn working group, confirmed that PV has to be diligent about the development and what they propose. There is a lengthy and detailed report and we all should read the details and be diligent, but there was no activity/changes in April.

Chair Holland (@ 41 min) explained the long process, but nevertheless stated it is "worth keeping our eyes on the ball"

Member Vertongen raised her concerns about the Planning Department, ongoing and past projects, and the involvement from the BPTS committee e.g. new driveways. There was a discussion with ASCC and PV senior Planner Adrienne Smith, but she feels there is no follow up after comments are made. She addressed the lack of consistency and hopes that the Chair will address this with the Planning Department. She brought up the example of the Hawthorn project.

Chair Holland confirmed that BPTS will be asked but only after the plans have been officially submitted to the Town.

Member Vertongen brought up the concern that sometimes meetings are cancelled, time elapses and comments are forgotten. Residents and committee members have repeatedly asked to be pro-active and suggested to repeat the issues at every meeting.

Chair Holland confirmed it will be, but right now the Hawthorn project has not submitted its formal application.

Resident Corley (@43 min) asked if the parking proposals for the Hawthorn Project have been brought to the Natural Resource Committee. There is a MRSOD process for parking approval, but she has not seen any report online. She would like to be informed about upcoming meetings.

Member Baenen confirmed that the Hawthorn project conducts an impressive and thorough review of the impact on natural resources. They are at the 8th option. Member Baenen also shared her observation and concerns that Members for the Hawthorn Project are very careful and interested to protect the Hawthorn property within the property lines, but not interested in the impact on our community. They fall short addressing the concerns in our community, but that is where "we" come in....

Resident Corley added that our roads lead to that property line. She agreed BPTS has a role, but wondered how to improve the process.

Member Baenen suggested to attend the monthly meetings, to continue to address concerns, and to speak at the meetings.

Resident Corley (@46.48 min) wondered if the Town Manager should be involved to represent the Town and the interests of about 1800 homes and 4500 people and be part of the decision making process.

Member Hey suggested to attend the MidPen Action Plan meeting on May 7 and Board of Directors meeting on May 8

Chair Holland confirmed he will keep this item on the agenda so BPTS will continue to be involved.

Member Baenen agreed and confirmed that BPTS has and continues to be involved.

d. Windy Hill parking restrictions – Review next steps for additional, enforceable signage.

PV PW Director Young was on vacation. No updates

e. Alpine Inn and Golden Oak Parking concerns

Chair Holland (@48.46 min) noted he had not received any new comments from residents nor the Town.

Member Vertongen stressed the importance for BPTS to work closely with the Parks and Rec Committee.

Confirmed by Chair Holland

Member Beaten noticed there was a no parking sign on Arastradero Road - April 30. She was surprised to see no cars parked.

Members Hey noted that parking is out of control on the weekends.

Member Vertongen raised her concern about the emergency exit

Member Welch confirmed that the boulders have been removed and although it is not labeled as an emergency exit, managers of Alpine Inn know this is an emergency exit. Staff keeps that exit clear.

Member Vertongen confirmed that Parks and Rec is hoping to designate 30 spots for the soccer teams Member Welch understood but raised the question of who would enforce the parking rule Resident Corley (@ 50.50) said it is the Town's responsibility because it is Town's property. Members agreed that the use of ropes to separate parking spots might be a solution
