
Local EOC Stations

AM Emergency Radio

- U WQQA726
 - ☐ FCC licensed TIS service on AM 1680 kHz, for Portola Valley
- ☐ Substantially all town residents can receive it
- Operational 24/7
- ☐ Live or pre-recorded broadcast
- □ Town Manager oversight
